

WHALE TALES HITS THE \$200,000 MARK

Each winter for the last eight years, Whale Trust Maui has hosted Whale Tales (formerly Whale Quest Kapalua), a free annual event that has raised over \$200,000 for whale research on Maui. Since its inception, Whales Tales has brought the Maui community up close and personal with some of the world's leading experts on whales, including world-renowned researchers, underwater photographers, filmmakers, artists, authors, and marine conservationists.

At the very heart of this event is a sense of community. Indeed, when Kapalua first approached us about how to create such an event, we knew it was important to establish a collaborative atmosphere to bring together Maui's whale researchers. Rather than compete for limited funding we decided to share our work and to support each other by also sharing the event's profits.

The results? A closely-knit community that includes researchers who have dedicated their lives to whales and whale lovers who return year after year to be part of this remarkable event. Apparently, we are not the only ones who think so. One recent attendee writes, "I love seeing the people who come every year. They are so passionate about the whales and the research being done. It is a big, wonderful family."

TRACKING WHALE SONGS ACROSS THE PACIFIC OCEAN

Humpback whales are famous for their complex, mysterious, and ever-changing songs but why they sing and how the song changes over space and time remains a mystery. To help address these questions, Dr. Jim Darling set out to record humpback whale songs throughout the North Pacific Ocean over three consecutive years. With the help of Jo Marie Acebes, Manami Yamaguchi, and Jorge Urban, whale songs were recorded concurrently on humpback breeding grounds in Hawaii, the Philippines, Japan, and Mexico from 2011 - 2013. We completed the fieldwork portion of this project in 2013 and are in the process of analyzing the results. Now the fun really begins! We are predicting that the singers closest in geographical proximity to one another (e.g., Japan and the Philippines) will have more similar songs than the whales furthest apart (e.g., Japan and Mexico), but if that is the case or not remains to be seen!

WHALE TRUST MAUI DONORS INVEST IN DRONES FOR RESEARCH – THE NEWEST RESEARCH TOOL FOR WHALES

The use of drones may be controversial in some circles, but they are having a big impact on how researchers collect data on free-ranging populations of whales, and that includes us here at Whale Trust Maui. Thanks to the support of many of you, we have now worked with engineers to design remote controlled aerial drones that we'll test this winter on Maui to help advance our research in the following ways:

- Measuring individual whales to determine how size/age affects social behavior;
- Recording aerial video sequences of behavioral interactions to assess relationships between whales within social groups (e.g., do some males cooperate around females?);
- Determining the sex, health and/or reproductive status of an individual by collecting DNA, bacteria and/or hormones from the exhalation (blow) of a whale.

WHALE TRUST PUBLISHES NEW SCIENTIFIC PAPER ON HUMPBACK WHALE SONGS

Researchers Jim Darling, Meagan Jones, and Flip Nicklin published results of the first round of song playback experiments with singing humpback whales off Maui in the Journal of the Acoustical Society of America (November 2012 Issue). As predicted, they found that male humpback whales singing off Maui tended to approach playback songs that were most similar to their own but moved away from those that were entirely different. This finding prompted a second round of playback studies, currently underway. While fieldwork and analysis are still ongoing, it is clear that the response of whales is more complicated than the initial experiment indicated. One new possibility is that it is not the composition of the song—at least what humans define as song composition—that determines the behavior of the singer but some other quality of the song that is yet to be defined. The team plans to further the playback experiments in April of this year.

SUPPORTING STUDENTS TO REACH THEIR GOALS

Sharing our data with students has aided the completion of two Master's theses in the last two years; led to the John P. Craven award for the "Most Inspired and Inspirational Presentation" at the University of Hawaii's Annual Marine Options Symposium based on Amber Simon's work with Whale Trust Maui; and contributed in part to two academic college scholarships for Lahainaluna High School students, Haley Robb and Josh Gotra. Congratulations!

CONGRATULATIONS!

Elisa Girola first began working as a research assistant with us in 2007. At that time, she used our data to investigate whether there was a connection between song characteristics and the size (age) of the singer. From there, Elisa went on to complete her Master's at the University of St. Andrews in Scotland, where she developed a quantitative and comprehensive method to estimate changes in whale song by studying progressive year-round changes of humpback whale song units from one breeding season through feeding season and into the next breeding season. This past year, Elisa began her Ph.D. study at the University of Queensland where she is investigating the impact of noise on humpback songs. Fortunately, she still makes time to join our team every year off Maui. We wish her all the luck on this next phase of her research into humpback whale songs!

EDUCATION

FROM THE FIELD TO THE LAB

It's not hard to fall in love with the ocean and whales but nurturing an appreciation of science – the quest to explore some of the greatest mysteries of our natural world – can seem daunting to many students faced with coursework filled with math, chemistry and physics.

One of our goals is to help dispel this fear and instill passion by engaging and supporting students to learn firsthand about all phases of the research experience – from the field to the lab – throughout their academic careers.

This year, students from elementary school to college (and beyond) helped Whale Trust Maui in the field and the lab.

RESEARCH INTERNSHIPS

We are currently working with the University of Hawaii's Maui College to develop and provide student research internship programs for undergraduates interested in the marine sciences.
